The following documentation should be submitted for a transfer within the jurisdiction:

Form CISR 857 – Application for Miscellaneous Services.

Form Request for Services (RFS) for re-issuing Insurance Certificates:

- Vessel >300GT need new:
 - Certificate for Wreck Removal Insurance.
- Vessels >1000GT need new:
 - Certificate for Wreck Removal Insurance; and
 - Certificate for Bunker Oil Pollution Insurance.

Blue Card from the Protection and Indemnity (P&I) Insurer the re-issue of Certificates of Insurance.

Current (within three month) Certificate of Good Standing for the owning company. If the company is incorporated in the Cayman Islands within the same year of the registration, a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation is sufficient. However, if the owner is an individual (or joint owners), a copy of his/her passport picture page either notarized or signed by an official person who works in a recognized profession (similar to those of passport requirements will be sufficient, e.g. Doctor, Accountant, Barrister etc.) is required.

Undertaking to return Certificate of British Registry.

Resolution of consent from the Mortgagee to Transfer Ports within the Jurisdiction (if applicable).

Transfer of Port within Jurisdiction fee.

Insurance Certificate fee.

Courier fee, where applicable.

Prior to transfer of port out, all outstanding fees must be settled.

Note: Once the Transfer of your vessel is complete, your Radio License will need to be re-issued. To do this please contact OfReg on licensing@ofreg.ky with their completed Radio license application form. Website: www.ofreg.ky
